The Hague Convention on the Civil Aspects of International Child Abduction may apply if the child has been taken to a country that is a signatory to that treaty. We work with the U.S. State Department to place appropriate alerts on passports, locate professional assistance in the other country, and take every step possible to ensure the child's safe return.

We are also skilled at foreseeing potential pitfalls when negotiating divorce or custody agreements where there may be a heightened risk of parental abduction. There is much that can be done to mitigate the risks while ensuring the child's best interests are met.
